## JIBS grading policy

JIBS uses a grading scale running from $A$ to $F$. The grades $A, B, C, D$, and $E$ are all passing grades. Students who receive an F or FX are offered re-examination on the course element(s) in question (e.g. written assignment, written exam, oral presentation).

| A | EXCELLENT performance | $90 \%$ of the maximum course point warrants the <br> student an A. |
| B | VERY GOOD performance | $80 \%$ of the maximum course point warrants the <br> student a B. |
| C | GOOD performance | $70 \%$ of the maximum course point warrants the <br> student a C. |
| D | SATISFACTORY performance | $65 \%$ of the maximum course point warrants the <br> student a D. |
| E | SUFFICIENT performance | $60 \%$ of the maximum course point is needed to pass <br> the course and get the grade E. |
| FX or F | FAIL with some or a lot of <br> work required before credit(s) <br> can be awarded | Students that perform below $60 \%$ will not pass the <br> course. |
